ARTIST DAN FROOT EXPLORES THROUGH THE POWER OF RADIO PLAYS REAL LIVES LIVING IN FULL HUMANITY THROUGH FOOD INSECURITY AND THE ENVIRONMENTS OF VIOLENCE, FINANCIAL FRAUD AND REFUGEE CIRCUMSTANCES THAT CREATE IT (CO-PRESENTED WITH AND AT THE MV PLAYHOUSE, IN ASSOCIATION WITH THE ISLAND GROWN INITIATIVE AND CRONIG'S MARKET)

The Yard's exciting, provocative and entertaining wintertime performance series, **THE WINTER YARD**, returns with another crop of important artists and companies, intersecting onstage and off with the Vineyard community, including the schools in The Yard's **MAKING IT** year-round initiative. Details on future events will be forthcoming.

In the meantime, first up is **DAN FROOT'S** *PANG!*, a set of true life stories and interviews of people caught in cycles of social violence, financial manipulation (think of the 2007 bank-fomented recession) and refugee discrimination - all of which dictate the common thread of food insecurity and chronic hunger, and the dignity to endure these stresses with love and humor. These portraits are distilled into three 25-minute radio plays along with a "kitchen table" discussion element involving both artists and audience members throughout the performance. *Pang!* aims to raise awareness, decrease stigma, and promote cross-class dialogue around circumstances faced by families living below the poverty line. - A single mom and nine children are swindled into foreclosure on their Los Angeles family home of 65 years.
- A family makes a harrowing escape from war-torn Burundi and resettles as refugees in Eastern Iowa, which proves traumatic in its own ways.

• A 7 year-old boy sows seeds of hope as he fantasizes his way out of a Miami neighborhood besieged by violence and beset by racist politics.

DAN FROOT & COMPANY *Pang! November 8 and 9, 2019* | *7:00pm* | *Martha's Vineyard Playhouse*

Pang! is an evening of short plays based on the oral histories of families hungering for change, performed as a live radio theater broadcast. **Pang!** aims to raise awareness, decrease stigma and promote cross-class dialogue around circumstances faced by families living below the poverty line. As both a stage play and a podcast, **Pang!** brings to life the humanity, dignity and complexity of the lives of families struggling to put food on the table.

A highlight of each performance of **Pang!** is a series of intimate discussions between audience members and community stakeholders. **Pang!** features an onstage "kitchen table" that is occupied by a shifting group of six audience members before, during and after the performance. It provides a place to socialize, eat and dialogue across socio-economic lines. The focus shifts at specific moments from the actors to the kitchen table, where audience members discuss the plays and the issues they engender, amplified so that all can hear.

DAN FROOT (producer, playwright, performer) is a producer, writer, composer, monologist, dancer and saxophonist. He received a Bessie Award for his music/theater work Seventeen Kilos of Garlic, and a City of Los Angeles Individual Artist Fellowship and National Foundation for Jewish Culture playwriting fellowship for his gangster-vaudeville, Shlammer (2005). Dan's music concerts, theater pieces and performance events have been presented by leading art centers across the U.S., and in Europe, Africa and South America. He has composed numerous scores for dance and theater companies, created an ongoing series of collaborative interdisciplinary duets with choreographer David Dorfman and danced, acted and played music nationally and internationally with the likes of Victoria Marks, Ralph Lemon, Yoshiko Chuma &

The School of Hard Knocks, Mabou Mines, David Cale, Ping Chong & Co. and Dan Hurlin. Dan teaches at UCLA's Department of World Arts and Cultures/Dance.
